MESSAGE TO SHAREHOLDERS

The co-op had another good year – with almost \$9 million in total patronage. This puts us on target with our projected rebate of approximately \$40 per ton.

We are pleased with the increase in members using the online Product Usage portal, which was double the number that had reported on-line last year, and accounted for over 60% of the total use reports received. In addition, those growers that have signed up to be paid via direct deposit increased from less than 10% to over 50%. These streamline the overall patronage process and provide real savings for the co-op. Thank you to those of you that have made the change to on-line reporting and direct deposit!

Proxies were mailed to members in early November, and are due back to our office prior to the Annual Meeting which will be held at our corporate office on February 20th. This year, along with voting for the Director in District 2, we have also included a few bylaw changes. Two of the changes are in regard to what constitutes a quorum. Specifically, that instead of a majority of Class A & B directors *combined* be present, it specifies that a majority of *each*, Class A directors and a majority of Class B directors, must be present.

Other changes pertain to stock ownership. We are requesting that membership not be limited to residents of California, but broadened to *doing business* in California. This allows us to expand our shareholder base geographically. We are also requesting the ability to clean up our inactive membership, which would provide a significant cost savings for your cooperative. If you have questions regarding any of these bylaw requests, please contact our office.

I look forward to visiting with you at our upcoming shareholder dinner meetings in January and February. We've included the schedule in this newsletter – we hope you'll be able to make it. Thanks again for your continued business and support! Here's wishing you all A Very Happy and Prosperous 2020!

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OPERATIONS UPDATE: COGEN UNIT 2 AND INFRASTRUCTURE





CALAMCO has successfully installed a second cogeneration unit at the Stockton Terminal.

This generator will provide approximately \$80,000 a year in savings by allowing the facility to avoid PG&E peak day pricing scenarios while simultaneously utilizing exhaust heat recovery to warm ammonia for truck loadout. Exhaust cooling has been upgraded to allow the generators to continuously meet this objective in the hottest summer periods without having to shed load. This new unit will also allow maintenance of Cogen Unit 1 with zero impact to operations.

In addition to the new Cogen Unit, we are also in the process of upgrading our aging electrical infrastructure at the Stockton Terminal to ensure compliance with the highest standards of reliability and safety. The main primary panel, automatic transfer switch, and UN32 feeder panel were replaced this year. This new switchgear minimizes operator interaction with circuit breakers by monitoring incoming power quality and allowing the automatic transfer and line up to our generators in the event of a power failure.




CALAMCO OFFERS \$1000 SCHOLARSHIP
