MESSAGE TO SHAREHOLDERS

Happy New Year – 2025!

We have now returned the 2^{nd} of our two ammonia tanks to full service after completing the 20-year internal inspection process. We owe hearty thanks to both our internal team and external partners as we look forward to another 20 years of safe and effective operation of the storage tanks.

With the recent closure of our fiscal year on October 30, we are happy to report the co-op earned \$6.2 million in patronage. While we are still collecting and evaluating patronage claims, we believe the rebate will be around \$55 per ton, which is in line with our original plan.

As the fall turns to winter and with an apparent good start to the rain/snow season, we are comfortable targeting a \$55 per ton patronage again in Fiscal Year 2025.
